## Dear Parents,

Many may be surprised to hear that the long-term impact of exceptional teaching in Reception has lasting impact on children. A new study published shows that pupils who are taught well during their first year of primary school are likely to earn more than their peers in later life and interestingly, that the "most effective" Reception classes produce pupils who can expect to earn between £2,000 and £7,500 more on average in their lifetime than their peers. This evidence builds on previous research conducted by Durham University that showed that children who are taught well in their first year of primary school go on to achieve better GCSE results in English and maths.

Here at Brooklands we have long recognised and valued the importance of great teachers working with our youngest children and this has been recognised formerly. We are regularly approached by schools across the country who ask to come and see what we are doing that is making such an impact in this area.

We are also lucky to benefit from the expertise of Hayley Aherne, Group Manager of Constable Country Childcare which offers provision from birth to 3 years within Brantham at St Michael's Pre-School and Brooklands Young Explorers, both of which have been identified as exceptional. Add to this, our very own, Grace Glanvill, is also recognised as an Evidence Leader in Education and is often invited to share her best practice with other schools within and beyond Suffolk.

Starting a new school can feel like a daunting step for many children, but it is reassuring for parents to know that you are in exceptional hands.
