

**Intervention or initiative:** Primary PE and Sport Premium

**Background:**

The school received £5409 (as of Spring 2014), from the Department for Education to improve the quality of PE and Sport for all children at Brooklands.

The impact of the Primary PE and Sport funding must highlight an increase in the participation, standards, attainment and progress of all pupils. Additionally, it should encourage pupils to develop healthy lifestyles and support children in reaching the performance levels that they are capable of.

Extra-Curricular opportunities	All year groups – Pupil Premium	£293.24	Pupil Perceptions  Participation levels	‘The vast majority felt well informed about the additional sport on offer and the vast majority felt that there was a good variety of sporting opportunities on offer at lunchtimes and after school.’ (taken from Mike Crichton’s report, Learning and Improvement PE Adviser)  Since September 2013, there has been a 23% increase in KS1 pupils participating in extra-curricular sporting opportunities and a 19% increase in KS2. 83% of Pupil Premium children are attending a sporting extra-curricular club, which is funded by the PE Premium. Brooklands is currently offering 8 extra-curricular sports clubs to pupils.
Diverse sports – Fencing and Karate	All year groups	£0	Participation levels	100% of pupils participated in Fencing and Karate sessions, where the high interest and engagement levels led to the demand of a Fencing Club.

Primary Pyramid links	KS2	£800	Competitive sporting opportunities (participation)  Quality of Teaching	<p>As a member of the East Bergholt Pyramid Sports Programme, KS2 pupils are able to compete in a range of Level 1 tournaments alongside other local Primary Schools. There are 5 festivals across the academic year.</p> <p>40% of KS2 teachers have worked alongside a qualified member of EBHS PE staff during the lead up to each festival to develop the quality of their teaching.</p> <p>Pupils have identified that they enjoy being taught by both their teacher and an external coach. 'They know more about the subject and challenge us with different games.' (Year 5 child)</p> <p>See breakdown summary of progress in 'Invasion' unit (Table 2).</p>
Sainsbury's School Games	All pupils	£175  £75	Competitive sporting opportunities (participation)  Diverse sports – participation levels	<p>Throughout the year, the School Games Organisers provide pupils with the opportunity to participate in a range of competitive activities, with a larger number of schools within the county e.g. Cross Country and Quadkids. So far, 60% of KS2 classes have had the opportunity to compete at this level.</p> <p>Sainsbury's School Games Organisers have provided Brooklands with a 'Change 4 Life' equipment bag that promotes healthy living and allows the club to be run effectively.</p> <p>This initiative also provides the school with sporting equipment that promotes Paralympic sports, e.g. Boccia, seated volleyball and table cricket. This has helped to promote inclusive sporting opportunities and has encouraged children to broaden the range of sports that they participate in.</p>

'There is a broad vision for PE and Sports provision now and into the future.'</p> <p>'Positive and outstanding relationships between pupils and their peers and teachers, which created a positive climate for participation and learning.'</p> <p>Following this monitoring review, Brooklands has set targets to continue to improve and develop Sport and PE.</p>

Teacher support – Squash  Links with Ardleigh Leisure	Year 3 and 4	£650	Pupil progress  Competitive sporting opportunities (Participation)	See breakdown summary of progress in 'Net/Wall' unit (Table 3).  100% of Year 3 and 4 pupils were taught by an ex-professional squash player, allowing them to participate in a new sport. They were then able to visit Ardleigh Leisure to use their facilities and practise their new skills. 15% of pupils extended this opportunity even further and returned to compete in a Squash Tournament, representing the school.
